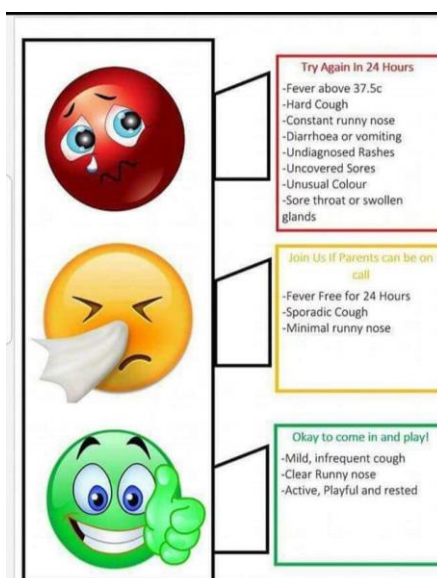
1-5: Tahi, rua, toru wha, rima!!
